At AMP SCITT we are fully committed to working with our partner schools to ensure the supply of well-qualified and engaging teachers for our local area.

We know our local schools require a dedicated, knowledgeable workforce, able to take on the challenge of ensuring that all learners succeed. The genuine collaboration with our partner schools is key to our rapid growth and the success of our PGCE with QTS programme.

In the local area we are unique in that we offer effective initial teacher training Programmes in primary and secondary education that are **designed, delivered and assessed** by practising teachers.

Our Programme is continually updated to reflect current practise and the challenges faced by teachers in local schools.



Our Programme

Home School (September – December)

Induction and Developing Practice

- School based training with a timetable that builds to 9 hours teaching per week by the end of the first term.
- 12 professional study days
- 6 Masters days
- 20 hours of subject specific pedagogy

Away school (January to February half term)

Consolidating and embedding practice

- School based training with a timetable of between 9 - 11 hours teaching per week.

Enrichment week

An opportunity to observe teaching to expand understanding of supporting pupils with differing needs in a variety of settings.

Final home placement (March – July)

Developing outstanding teaching

- School based training with a timetable that builds to 13 hours / 70% teaching per week.
- 2 training days to transition to NQT.
- 1 week working in employing school

A programme that benefits your pupils

The home - away - home placement model allows trainees to become immersed in school life, benefitting pupils and staff in your school by;

- Providing additional staff in the pastoral teams to support pupils' needs
- Intervention work to boost exam performance in 1-1 and small groups
- Supporting the extracurricular timetable to provide greater range of opportunities to your pupils
- Supporting homework / revision clubs to enhance exam results
- Supporting the school staff as part of the duty rota
- Contributing to lesson planning and differentiated resources for subject departments to incorporate into schemes of work.

Recruitment of trainees onto the programme is rigorous and led by senior staff. Partnership schools can be involved in interviews if they want.

A programme that benefits your staff

Our partner schools have seen increased retention and upskilling of existing staff due to development opportunities through AMP SCITT providing schools with better progression and succession planning.

Career development

Vacancies for posts to support AMP SCITT are advertised across all partner schools allowing teachers to develop skills without leaving their current post.

Invitation to AMP SCITT CPD training accredited by NASBTT. All partner schools can send staff to free twilight CPD.

- Level 1 Coaching and Mentoring
- Level 2 Advanced Coaching and Mentoring
- Level 2 Delivering Inspiring CPD

Other training provided to partnership schools include:

- NPQ
- Mentally Healthy School
- Curriculum for Oracy

Networking opportunities are also created through teach meets.





Financial Benefits

We do expect our schools to

- Provide a home coach who meets formally each week to review performance and set targets
- Provide a professional mentor who delivers a weekly training session to all trainees
- Provide lesson observations by subject specific staff.
- Engage in mentor training and update meetings

In recognition of this time commitment we pay our schools generous placement fees

- Home placement **£2000**
- Away placement **£400**

Other financial benefits have been seen in a reduction of recruitment costs where partner schools avoid agency and advertising fees by recruiting directly from AMP SCITT trainees.
